Piñon Canyon Expansion came to an emotional head

last week with the possible sale or lease of about

70,000 acres of land just south of the Piñon canyon

Maneuver Site (PCMS).

The roller coaster ride for ranchers and residents began early last week when sources leaked to the press that an announcement would be made in Trinidad about a sale or lease by Denver businessman Craig Walker to obtain some or all of his 70,000 acres of land south of the PCMS.

The Assistant Secretary for Army Installations Keith Eastin, who was appointed by President Bush, said early in the week that he would be coming to southeast Colorado to hold discussions on a lease or expansion. Early on Army officials did not confirm or deny an agreement with Walker.

By midweek Eastin's agenda for his visit to Colorado had been shortened.

Recently elected Rep. Betsy Markey D-Colo., sent a strong letter of opposition to the expansion of PCMS to Robert Gates the Defense Secretary. Markey could not understand why Eastin and the Army still are



MTV's Diggity Dave brings his message to fans at Raton High School

Dave Aragon padlocked a length of chain around his neck twenty years ago; it's still there. He told his audience of 300 students and teachers at Raton High School Friday that the chain has served him as a symbol and reminder of his early commitment to never do drugs.

He offered his own life as a compelling alternative, an example of how much one may accomplish if he or she doesn't throw away time "getting high". Now known professionally as Diggity Dave, he reaches tens of millions each week as a host of MTV's popular car makeover show "Pimp My Ride". He's been in rock bands signed by two major labels. Last year he starred with rapper Ludacris and Motley Crue's Tommy Lee in "Battleground Earth", shown

on both The Learning Channel and The Discovery Channel's new "Planet Green" network. He's currently directing the reality show "Dare Devilution."

He traced his rapid rise for the gathered students. A high school dropout in Denver, he made his no drugs commitment and passed his GED, then headed for Los Angeles. He said his two successful bands and three TV projects were all accomplished within Continued on page 5
