Chavez & Son Construction receives national recognition

"I've never heard a bad word spoken about the way they do business, the quality of their work or the way they treat their employees," said Las Animas County Commissioner Gary Hill. These are but a few of the qualities that have made a small construction company in the quiet little community of Weston rise to

There's a post office, a general store, a church and a smattering of homes in this small mountain town west of Trinidad on Highway 12; and sitting in their midst is Felix Chavez & Son Construction, which has just been recognized as Contractor of the Year by Equipment World Magazine and Caterpillar, making them a new legend on the Scenic Highway of Legends.

Owner and managers Ryan and Tina Chavez, their aunt Joan Shannon and Wagner Equipment salesman for Caterpillar in Pueblo, Mike Lewis, and his wife, Julie, traveled to Las Vegas, Nev., recently to attend the ceremony, only knowing that the company made it into the top 12 finishers. They soon found out that this was no small feat as there was a field of 70,000 applications that were weeded through to reach this number. Annually, Wagner Equipment salesmen in both North and South America nominate construction companies that are owner operated, with an annual income of less that \$20 million. whose owners are active in their business and with their employ-

"They call us a dying breed," Ryan Chavez said in a quiet but resolute voice. "It's a constant battle. You have to fight and adapt

your business and keep thinking about how to keep going." His father, Felix, whose name the company bears, knew that, having been in the business most of his life as well as being a rancher and farmer.

"He didn't want to continue in the business," Ryan explained, "but after I graduated from high school, that's what I wanted to do. A friend of mine told me that he remembers ever since I was about 5 years old, I just wanted to play with trucks and dozers and those kinds of toys. I didn't want to go to college, even though I had some scholarships. I've just wanted to operate machinery all of my life."

Felix Chavez Construction officially started up in 1990 and went full swing in 1993 when they began hiring employees. Ryan's sister, Jennifer, is the office manager; his wife, Tina, is

Shuler crowd comes to the Cabaret

RATON - The Shuler Theater crowd descended into the dark decadence of Berlin's Kit Kat Klub when Windwood Theatricals' national-touring production of the musical Cabaret arrived in Raton Friday night.

Winner of almost two-dozen Tony Awards, including Best Musical, the popular show has enjoyed three long runs on Broadway - in the 1960s, 1980s, and 1990s - though it may be best known for the 1972 film version starring Joel Grey as the Master of Ceremonies and Liza Minnelli as actress Sally Bowles. The Shuler show was brought to town by the Raton Arts & Humanities Council.

The Windwood production featured an impressive ensemble the company of 40 actors, musicians, and crew is on the road nonstop from January to June, traveling in two full-size buses with one large equipment trailer and an additional 18-wheel semi - led by an extraordinary performance

No change in Raton election

RATON - Following a Monday morning public recount/recheck of the votes cast in the March 2 municipal election, results showed that the original vote count will stand.

"The returns were publicly canvassed immediately following and the results were certified again indicating no changes to the March 2, 2010, election results,' according to a statement released by Raton City Clerk

Michael Anne Lannon. The recount/recheck was conducted at 9 a.m. at the City Commission Chambers, in the presence of the Precinct Board Members, Lannon, County Clerk Rayetta Trujillo, District Court Judge Paternoster, and Magistrate Judge Warren Walton, according to the public notice released by

Lannon. District 3 City Commission candidate Lorenzo Flores filed for the recount after finishing two votes behind incumbent Jesse Johnson. Flores ended up with 482 votes to Johnson's 484 votes, in results that still stand. Fellow candidate Roger Rael received 54 votes.

District Commissioner, Sandra Mantz won with 481 votes, followed by Christopher Candelario with 320 and Sara

Kowalski with 232. For municipal judge, Roy Manfredi won with 778 votes, followed by Stephen Draper with 184 votes and write-in Omer Horn with 50 votes.
