Trinidad High students bask in photographic talents

An interest in photography is developing at Trinidad High School, and helping to shed light on the subject is a new photography competition that organizers hope to make an annual event. The Spirit of the West photo competition was open to all THS students and the subject matter was wide open. Photos could be color or black and white. Entries were judged on artistic achievement in photography.

Organizer Lori O'Connor said she came up with the idea of the competition as a way to help local students win awards that will help them earn scholarships if they choose to go on to college. She said that her own daughter was able to win some awards while in high school

and that she is convinced that that helped her land a college scholarship. Those who decide who will receive scholarships look for little extra things on applications, such as awards, O'Connor said.

Another goal behind the Spirit of the West is to recognize the Altman family, Trinidad's famous western photographers, dating back to 1890, including her grandfather, O'Connor said. The original Altman photos are a treasured part of the Mitchell Museum collection and are on display inside Trinidad First National Bank.

Winners included:

- 1st place - Maddie Danielson, \$100.
- 2nd place - Gianna Torres, \$85.
- 3rd place - Ashlyn Pike, \$65.

Judges' Special Award - Synovia Dunkin and Cody Cloud, \$50 each.

Trinidad First National Bank Award - Ashlyn Pike, \$100 savings bond.

Prize money was donated by Griego Insurance, Wendy's, Trinidad First National Bank, Dr. Marci Bowers and Wal-Mart. The judges were Dave Frank, Joe Tarabino and Paula Murphy.

The winning photographs will be on display in the window of the Mitchell Museum at least through the holidays. Also, the Mitchell is donating a digital camera to the THS Art Department. Art teacher Maria Holdershaw said the department currently only has one camera for all the students to use and welcomed any other camera donations.
