The goal of these groups is to educate Trout Unlimited members from across the state about the newly formed chapter and the Purgatoire River Restoration Project

The Purgatoire River Anglers Chapter #100 of Trout Unlimited was founded in August 2009 by a group of local Trinidad citizens with a strong desire to protect and restore the river. The Purgatoire River Anglers are part of a network of 22 Trout Unlimited Chapters in Colorado. With 10,000 members across the state, Colorado Trout Unlimited works on the ground to conserve, protect and restore Colorado's rivers and watersheds.

From the Trinidad chapter the idea to restore the Purgatoire River below Trinidad Dam emerged; the purpose of Purgatoire River Improvement Project is to improve the aquatic habitat and riparian areas from the Trinidad State Park Lake dam through the town of Trinidad, to the Highway 160 Bypass, approximately 4-3/4 miles of river. The Planning Phase will result in a written assessment of the current conditions and a feasibility study for designing and funding future work projects.

The Purgatoire River, a free flowing trout stream, was dammed in the 1970s to create Trinidad Lake. Low winter flows and poor structure in the river have prevented a sustainable trout population. In recent Colorado Trout Unlimited meets in Trinidad Saturdayyears, many people in the community have become supportive of efforts to clean up the river trails and improve the habitat.
