## Jeri Sager brings Broadway to Raton By TIM KELLER The Chronicle-News

Longtime Broadway singer/actress Jeri Sager brought her one-woman touring show to Raton's Shuler Theater Thursday night, sharing an evening of 17 show tunes with an appreciative audience that appeared to know every

Sager, who hails from Nashville after 15 years of living in New York City, was supported by a talented quartet of musicians who remained resolutely in the background: the spotlight belonged to Sager throughout the entertaining show.

The program was a Greatest Hits of Broadway, beginning with "All That Jazz" from the show Chicago, moving on to "I Dreamed a Dream" from Les Miserables, "Blues in the Night" from Swing, and "Don't Cry for Me, Argentina" from Evita.

Sager inserted one unfamiliar song right after her opener: "Jeri with a J" was her fun and funny introduction to the audience, comically and skillfully playing with the troubles people have in getting her name right. It's Jeri, not Teri, and Ms. Sager is not related to Bob Segar. Whoever wrote this song deserves credit for creating a winning vocal tour de force that won over the audience right at the top of the show.

Between songs from such Broadway hits as Oklahoma, Showboat, Funny Girl, Sweet Charity, On a Clear Day, and Bye Bye Birdie, Sager spent a lot of the two-hour show talking to the audience, spinning tales from her life and career. She grew up listening to her parents' Broadway soundtrack LPs

("Remember LPs? Vinyl you didn't wear."), coming home from school to an empty house where she held a hairbrush microphone in front of the fulllength mirror and belted out show tunes.

She imagined herself in the ruby slippers of heroes Garland, Liza Judy Minnelli, Julie Andrews, and Barbra Streisand. Their influence pervades "Broadway by Jeri."

Sager's band consisted of pianist Justin Stanton, percussionist David Nelson, electric bassist Doug Largent, and Kenny Anderson on saxophones, flute, and clarinet. They were good enough that it was easy to wish Sager would give them the spotlight and let them show off

The show's emotional highlight came with Sager's closer, the poignant song "Memory" from Cats, which she sang for 2 1/2 years in the role of Grizabella ("Griz") on Broadway. Only here did she seem to draw deeper than the consummate show person and actress to tap into a vulnerability and tenderness that suggested something deeper and more

She threw in "Cabaret" as an encore, allowing her to leave on a high note. As the band played out the closing, she strolled right up the aisle and brought the audience with her into the lobby, where she greeted fans and autographed CDs long after the show's end.


