TSD Board approves new online school

George Dasko called it a school within a school. The Trinidad School Board voted unanimously at Tuesday's meeting to establish a new online school as a part of its academic opportunities for local students.

Dasko showed board members 17 requests by local students to send their records to GOAL Academy. Should all 17 of those students leave the district and go to GOAL, Dasko said it represented a loss of \$115,600 at the current rate of \$6,800 per pupil in state funding. There were seven similar requests to send transcripts to other school districts in the area.

New Superintendent Scott Mader said Dasko and Business Manager Bill Cordova had brought up the issue of trying to retain as many students as possible within the district, and trying to get back those students who had previously left for online or other schools. The longtime girl's basketball coach at Trinidad High School used a sports allegory to highlight his remarks.

"You know, they say in coaching that the worst thing you can do is wait until the opposing team takes the field and then prepare for them," Dasko said. "That's where we're at. We're at a point where GOAL Academy is our competition. We have 17 kids who would be freshmen at our high school who have applied at GOAL Academy and they'll probably be accepted. I look at it and I say, 'can we lose 17 kids out of every class that comes in?' I don't think we can. They're our competition. We're going to play fair and be aboveboard with everything, but I

think we need to compete and start an online school in our district. I don't think we can wait until next year. I don't think we can wait at all. I think we need to do it and do it right now, because what's going to happen is we're going to lose some kids. They may not cut it at GOAL, but after the October student count, do you know where they're going? They're coming back to our district. So it's really

up to us to keep these kids here, deal with them and provide the best possible venue to a good education for them."

The program Dasko proposed would be tailored to fit the needs of each individual student, so they can develop the skills they'll need to move forward academically. It would include a typical online program where a student spends six hours a day working on various

classes at home, while being monitored by a teacher. The student would have to check in on a regular basis. Another option would be for students to be in classrooms for their elective classes, but take their core classes online in a computer lab where they could work at their own pace. The program would include credit recovery, so students who have fallen behind

Lip Sync 2014 filled the Shuler Theater Friday and Saturday nights as whole families took turns hamming it up and goofing around for the entertainment of their friends and neighbors. The oldest performers to take the stage were in their 80s; the youngest was six-months old. There was an equal mix of adults and children, often together in a single performance.

Cathy and Chris Padilla of Raton won the 37th-annual event's \$200 first prize for their comic performance acting and lip-syncing "Love Runs Out" by the group One

Republic. Portraying an elderly woman and man at "Ol' Fogie Restin' Home," they took a long time slowly walking onto the stage in silence, aided by a walker and a cane, respectively. The Padillas said after the show that they've entered the contest for many years. Their previous best result was last year's 3rd place when Chris sang as Michael Bublé. He failed to place this year with his impersonation of Elvis, but his "Jailhouse Rock" won him 4th place in 2012.

Vintage Treasures thrives in new location

Getting shoppers through the door to see what's available is the key first step toward success for any retail business. Bree Pappan said recently that moving her Vintage Treasures Antiques and Collectibles business three blocks south to 108 N. Commercial St. recently has caused more shoppers to stroll through the door.

Pappen's had a brick and mortar store in Trinidad for the past two years, selling stylish vintage clothing and accessories focused on the styles and patterns that were all the rage in the first half of the 20th Century. Prior to that, she had a long career as a picker for high-end boutiques in the Tucson and Scottsdale areas of Arizona, and in Southern California. She sold antiques out of her home there and also did some consignment work. She learned the ins and outs of the antiquing trade with the help of a friend she refers to as "my mentor".

But since it's not going to happen, he should make plain to his family that HE prefers to be the bearer of this kind of news, and the reason they aren't hearing it from you is because he wants it that way.

When we do speak, her husband often interiects or starts another conversation with her, as if she isn't on the phone. She also settles spats between her toddlers and other things her husband could manage while we're talking.

As it stands, we speak only a few times a year, and I'd like her undivided attention. I have tried bringing this up a number of times, but she feels life doesn't stand still for anyone.

It may be that her husband is ultra-controlling -- hence the constant interruptions from him - or that her household is so disorganized she's in the middle of a whirlwind.

If you haven't already, write her a letter and express your feelings. It's one way of getting your thoughts across without being interrupted. I don't think 30 minutes three times a cific time to talk when her kids and husband aren't around. Then cross your fingers and hope she sees the light.
