NEW BUSINESS UNDERWAY

Dirt Flying at Sparq CNG refueling station

The massive construction crane looming above the Goddard Avenue exit off of Interstate 25 in north Trinidad will be a community fixture for a while as the Sparq Compressed Natural Gas (CNG) refueling station becomes a permanent part of the local travel scene. Toxie Dearman of NGV Fleet Partners, the Oklahoma firm doing the construction work, said the CNG station, located on the site of an existing Shell gas station, should be ready to go within nine weeks of Thursday's construction start.

Dearman said the construction would not affect the operations of the Shell station, and that NGV would have about 10 workers toiling away on the CNG construction project day-to-day until completion. Early preparation took about five weeks, before the half-dozen tractor-trailers rolled into town Thursday with all of the equipment needed to bring the CNG station to life.

"We're right on schedule. The rain hasn't hurt us too bad," Dearman said. "We're anticipating being out of here before October 1. There will be two dispensers with two hoses each. There will be two light duty pumps with smaller hoses, and two GB5000 hoses

for bigger trucks, so they can fuel faster."

The refueling infrastructure for the CNG industry is still being put into place, he said, but progress had been rapid and steady. There will be more and more CNG refueling stations popping up around the U.S. as more package truck and over-the-road trucking fleets convert to the more fuel-efficient CNG as their prime source of fuel.

"In two years you'll probably see a lot more CNG stations than we have now," he said. "Like down South, Waste Management has gone to 100 percent dedicated CNG's, the garbage trucks and stuff. It's just such a more fuel-efficient system for them."

Dearman also mentioned some of the local partnerships that have been developed with Trinidad area trucking fleets to utilize the more efficient CNG fuel.

"There are several already. Sparq, who actually owns this, is a natural gas company out of Oklahoma City, and they already have several commitments from local fleets. These are all fast fueling stations. Most everybody does the half-inch tubing, but Sparq was wise enough to go with the one-inch tubing, which gives a much faster rate of flow, which compares very favorably with diesel

SUMMER ENTERTAINMENT

Shuler's Lip Sync zaniness back for 38th year

RATON — Billed as "Hometown Entertainment!" Lip Sync 2015 promises so much merriment and music-making that it's spread across two nights at the Shuler Theater this weekend. The 38th annual community benefit show pits local "performers" in a competition judged partly on synchronized "singing" to classis songs, but especially on the fun factor of costumes and immersion in the part. People who say they'll never get on a stage see this annual show and come back the next year disguised as Elvis Presley or Marilyn Monroe.

"It's a night of laughter and family entertainment," Eileen Gonzales says. She started the fundraising event in the 1970s when her mother was diagnosed with diabetes. The event's proceeds provide insulin, blood-sugar monitors and other medical supplies to diabetics throughout the area, stretching from Raton to Clayton to Cimarron to Trinidad. Gonzales lost her mother to diabetes, but the

show has lived on. The annual Lip Sync extravaganza always fills the Shuler auditorium and its balcony both nights. It's so popular that this year's line-up of acts was already full three weeks ago. Twenty-eight acts will perform this Friday night, then they'll do it again Saturday night. Whole families take turns hamming it up and goofing around for the entertainment of their friends and neighbors. Last year, the oldest performer to take

the stage was in her 80s; the youngest was six-months old. There was an equal mix of adults and children on stage, often together in a single performance.

Cathy and Chris Padilla of Raton won last year's \$200 first prize with their comic performance acting and lip-syncing "Love Runs Out" by the group One Republic. Portraying an elderly woman and man at "O! Fogie Restin' Home,"

they took a long time slowly walking onto the stage in silence, aided by a walker and a cane, respectively. When they sat down, the music started. The old man grew frisky and the old woman dealt with it: by the time they were done, they'd been dancing and the old man was exhausted. The audience loved it. So did the judges.

The Padillas said after the show that they've entered the contest for many years. Chris failed to place last year with his impersonation of Elvis, but his "Jailhouse Rock" won him 4th place in 2012.

Because set changes are required between each of the 28 acts, half of each night's show consists of repartee and silliness from hosts Robi Gonzales and Sean Green, who have been honing their act annually for a quarter-century.

The show's program lists each song and the artist that made the recording, but not the names of the local performers who are often disguised in elaborate costumes to lip sync the night's songs. It doesn't really matter who's in each disguise, though it's still fun guessing; what works is just knowing that it's your neighbor or co-worker or mechanic or bank teller.

It's so rollicking and fun that small children in the audience never cause a disturbance; in fact, chances are good that they're playing dress-up and getting ready to play on stage. It's a comedy show and a variety show that's absolutely unique to Raton and, since the 1970s, a highlight of every Raton summer.

Gonzales and her family and supporters go door to door signing up sponsors to raise funds to fight diabetes. Last year's list of sponsoring businesses numbered more than 100, filling two pages of small print in the program. Except for cash prizes to the winning acts, there's no overhead—all of the money goes directly to purchasing supplies and equipment for local

diabetics.

The sponsors help Gonzales keep the admission price low—just \$5 for adults, \$4 for seniors, and \$3 for children 12 and under. She says, "I keep the price low because I want everyone to see the Shuler Theater! She's like a beautiful woman: She ages beautifully. Everyone can afford to come to this show. Relatives come to see relatives and neighbors come to see neighbors. Once people come, they keep coming back year after year."

The complete show runs for two full nights, Friday and Saturday, August 14-15, beginning each evening at 7 p.m. Judges score every performance. After Saturday night's show, they'll tally the scores from both nights to determine the winners, who will be announced on stage after the show.

CBI Celebrates National Forensic Science Week August 9-15

August 9-15 marks National Forensic Science Week and the Colorado Bureau of Investigation (CBI) Forensic Services section is planning a handful of events to honor the work of forensic scientists assigned to CBI laboratories around the state.

CBI forensic scientists, crime scene investigators and forensic examiners work with more than 200 Colorado public safety agencies to provide timely and accurate results in several scientific disciplines and other crime scene support including: DNA casework, latent fingerprints, firearms, tool mark analysis, drug chemistry, crime scene investigation, serology, trace evidence, digital evidence, DNA database management and Toxicology.

"National Forensic Science Week spotlights the importance of forensic science in the pursuit of justice for crime victims and their families," said CBI Deputy Director Jan Girten who oversees Forensic Services for the bureau. "The CBI Forensic Services section is comprised of highly qualified scientists and analysts who work tirelessly in their efforts to produce results of the highest quality in a timely manner."

CBI Forensic Services Highlights include:

- CBI Forensic Services has completed testing on previously untested sex assault kits submitted as part of legislation passed in 2013. Results from the testing will continue through the summer.
- CBI Forensic Services launched Toxicology testing for the state beginning July 1, 2015.
- CBI Forensic Services received international accreditation through the American Society of Crime Laboratory Directors/Laboratory Accreditation Board

(ASCLD/LAB) International Organization of Standards (ISO) in May.

■ CBI Forensic Services received more than 9,000 cases for testing in 2014.
