Child shot in local accident airlifted by Flight for Life to Denver

An unidentified eight year-old boy was tragically shot in the head Monday in Trinidad. Police dispatch received a call that a male party was injured and needed attention at the Goddard Street Shell Station at approximately 12:01 p.m. Personnel from the Trinidad Ambulance District and Trinidad Fire Department arrived on the scene and determined that the injured party was a child, approximately eight years old, who had sustained a gunshot to the head.

Trinidad Police officers arrived on the scene and determined that the child had been in a vehicle in the station's parking lot with his two brothers, aged five and 12, when the incident occurred.

The child was transported to the Emergency Room at Mt. San Rafael Hospital and then flown out via Flight for Life helicopter to Children's Hospital in Denver, according to police.

The Colorado Bureau of Investigation has been called in to assist in the investigation.

Details of the incident will be forthcoming as they are made available to The Chronicle-News.

Local Preschools, Early Childhood Centers not impacted by new state licensing standards

New state standards requiring healthy meals, playground time, limits on television viewing and a ban on sugary drinks go into effect on February 1, 2016. Some of the approximately 2,000 state-licensed child care centers have expressed concerns that the new standards could hurt their businesses and the state has promised help in implementing the new standards, but a Monday phone survey of several local early childcare and preschool providers in Trinidad indicated that they already use those standards and they all said they wouldn't be negatively impacted by the changes in child care stan-

The new licensing standards were approved last month, according to an Associated Press story.





Chamber seeks nominees for annual Chenoweth Award

One of the most respected awards given out regularly in Trinidad has been the Chenoweth Award, named after the late Judge and longtime U.S. Congressman John Edgar Chenoweth. The Trinidad and Las Animas County Chamber of Commerce (TLACC) is now seeking nominations for the 2015 Chenoweth Award.

Last year the Griego family was presented with the award with Ed, Karen and Kathleen Griego accepting. Other nominees last year included the late Lonnie Adkisson, Linda Perry, Jay Cimino, Judge John Garcia, the Griego family, Noreen Hazen, Loyd Holliman, Marilyn Leuszler, Terry Lobato, Anthony Mattie, Yolande Romero, Ann Salbato-Large, Lou Simpleman and Charlene Tortorice.

The annual award was revived a year ago after a year absence. At that time, 2012 Chenoweth Award recipient Tom Perry highlighted the importance of the community-centered award and it's importance to the Chamber. "As you know," said Perry, "the Chamber of Commerce is working very hard to get the Chamber back up and running and serving the community in many ways. One of these ways is with the annual Chenoweth Award. One of the goals is to re-energize the Chenoweth Award process and to build a strong pool of nominated candidates from which the Chamber Board will select the recipient of this prestigious

In an email announcing the nomination process for this year the Chamber said, "Some of the examples of character of the late J. Edger Chenoweth include responsibility, respectfulness, caring, giving, positive attitude, trustworthiness, cooperation, honesty and many others.'

The award dates back to 1979 and honors a distinguished local citizen for their outstanding service to the community. Any citizen of Trinidad or Las Animas County can be nominated, although former Chenoweth Award winners are ineligible. Past recipients of this prestigious award include the Ed Griego Family, Tom Perry, Howard Lackey, Jack Bearden, Roberta Cordova, Joe Reorda, Linda Barron, John Tarabino and others.

The presentation of this annual award will take place in mid February and the deadline for nominations is January 22, 2016. Nomination forms can be picked up at the Chamber office, or by calling 719-846-9285, or through email at tlacchamber@outlook.com. The Chamber asks that people provide a phone number and/or email address of the nominee so the Chamber office may contact them.

Each nominee will be asked for biographical information, which will be reviewed by past award winners to come up with a list of finalists. The TLACC board of directors will make the final decision on the award winner, whose name will be announced at the banquet.

Judge Chenoweth served in Congress for 22 years, during the period from 1940 through 1964. His core values represented a shining example to his community, and are the same values that will be used to decide this year's Chenoweth Award winner.
