Commissioners vote to keep health department bi-county entity

Last week at the regular meeting of the Las Animas County board of County Commissioners a resolution was passed to continue the local Health Department as a bi-county entity. Also last Tuesday the Huerfano County Commissioners passed a similar resolution to continue the partnership with Las Animas County to maintain the bi-county health department.

With only one third of counties in Colorado with a health department both Las Animas and Huerfano counties are privileged to have a local health department.

Last year Senate Bill 08-194 "The Public Health Reauthorization Act" was passed without objection to modernize public health. Basically this bill is a technical clean up amendment.

The bill was enacted to help all counties in Colorado participate in Colorado's health services program.

Obama claims gains in revival from economic chaos

WASHINGTON (AP) - President Barack Obama claimed early progress Tuesday night in his aggressive campaign to lead the nation out of economic chaos and declared that despite obstacles ahead, "we're moving in the right direction."

At the second prime-time news conference of his presidency, Obama also toned down his criticism of bonuses to executives at bailed-out AIG, and shot back at Republican critics of his budget.

In office for 64 tumultuous days, Obama cast his budget - now under review in Congress - as essential if the economy is to recover. The tax and spending plan "is inseparable from this recovery because it is what lays the foundation for a secure and lasting prosperity," he said.

The president also defended the U.S. dollar in the wake of China's sug-
