## RHS Drama excels at Portales Festival

**RATON** - For the second consecutive year, Raton High School's Drama Club

took a play to the regional competition at Portales, coming home with a pair of awards.

The 55th Annual Eastern New Mexico - West Texas Drama Festival drew high school drama clubs from across New Mexico and Texas for four days last week. Performances and workshops took place at the University Theater Center of Eastern New Mexico University.

The RHS thespians presented a 35-minute one-act play called "Hard Candy," a job-interview comedy. The eleven actors and three technical-crew members earned judges' awards for excellence in both character development and ensemble energy.

Discussing some of the lessons learned at the festival, Etta Briscoe said, "I learned to stay in character

through a half-hour on stage." James Angeli improved his diction, saying, "I learned to enunciate."

Amanda Mehn stepped in as a last-minute replacement, memorizing her lines in just three days. Mariah Fleming had a scare in the air. "Catwalks are scary," she said. "I got lost up on one of them. That wasn't fun."

First-year English teacher and Drama Club sponsor Quincey Burkhalter said, "It was a good trip for me. We had a lot of down time together. It helped me get to know the kids." A comic improvisation workshop "gave me a lot of ideas for things I can do in teaching my classes," Burkhalter said.

Other workshops available to participants included stage combat, acting for

a camera, various types of dance, technical tours, play-writing, stage direction, and others. Some students auditioned for college scholarships, while others took tours of the ENMU campus.

Raton's students remarked that the plays presented by other schools were "incredible," but all agreed that Santa Fe High School's "Things Falling" was the best. As Fleming recalled, "The whole audience was crying. It got a standing ovation."

Raton club members said they hope to carry that inspiration into their own local performances. Next up for many of the RHS Drama Club members is a production by Raton Youth Theater of Grimm's Fairy Tales at the Shuler Theater next week, March 5-7.
