New Mexico senator announces field office hours for week of August 16 in area

New Mexico's junior U.S. Senator Tom Udall keeps a staff of a dozen field representatives on the road throughout the state to help serve the needs of his constituents. Udall announced Thursday that his representative Lauren Arias will hold office hours Monday through Wednesday in four northeastern New Mexico communities.

Arias will be at the Union County Senior Center, 19 East Broadway, in Clayton Monday from 11 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.

Tuesday she'll be at the Springer Senior Center, 600 Maxwell Ave., from 10 to 11 a.m., then in the atrium of the Raton Senior Center, 440 S. 1st St., from noon to 1 p.m. Tuesday. Wednesday she moves to Mosquero Senior Center, 24 Main St., where she'll be available from 10:30 a.m. to noon.

Thursday, Udall encouraged residents to stop by for any kind of assistance. "If you're having trouble with a federal agency for things like veterans' or social secu-

rity benefits, my office is here to help. I encourage you to meet with Lauren to review your case and find out what help is available. As your United States Senator, it is my goal to provide every New Mexican with excellent representation and assistance."

Udall provided a list of

topics for which his office often provides assistance. They include veterans' eligibility and benefits, VA home loans, and replacements of medals earned. Problems with social security often include eligibility, benefits, and missing checks. Housing issues range from HUD and federal loan programs to issues with housing vouchers.

Udall's office can assist in obtaining an emergency passport, replacing a lost passport, or advising on overseas travel restrictions and warnings. His staff often assists with naturalization applications, immigration petitions for relatives, and adjustment of status applications that are delayed or lost.

Udall maintains specific information for New Mexico's northeastern region under the "In Your Area" tab at his website tomudall.senate.gov, where he can also be contacted with inquiries.
