

– Sally Ruybalid, THS sophomore (Trinidad)




“Just being outdoors — the water and fun with family and friends. I love the outdoor pool here.”

Kiwanis Kares for Kids

The Trinidad Kiwanis Club hosts a variety of fundraisers throughout the year and utilizes the proceeds to provide items for children such as books, camp opportunities and sometimes necessities. Most recently, as part of the Kiwanis Kares for Kids project, warm fuzzy blankets, stuffed animals and books, as well as child backpacks, were purchased for donations. Kiwanis members ordered the merchandise, assembled the backpacks and then gave the items to the Las Animas County Department of Human Services to have on hand to disperse as needed.

The filled backpacks, 50 in total, were donated to DHS so that when children are displaced from their homes they can be given a backpack to have something warm and fuzzy to help them through the process of an extremely stressful transition.

Montoya scores rare ace



“After playing golf for all those years, I finally got my due,” said an elated Montoya. “I finally got one. I can’t tell you how nice it was. It was totally awesome.”

Playing partner Toni Merino also thought it was a pretty good shot. “It was a beautiful hole-in-one,” said Merino, who has scored an ace on hole No. 7, and another No. 5 in a Trinidad Latin tournament. “Toni’s shot was high, hit the green and took two bounces, then went in.
