

Miners shut out Raton, bring Coal Bucket back to Trinidad

After falling short of winning the Coal Bucket last season, the Trinidad Miners made sure they got the job done this year, in shutout fashion, as they defeated the Raton Tigers at Miner Stadium on Friday night by a final score of 47-0 to bring the coveted Coal Bucket back home to Trinidad.

Quarterback Vance Ferraro and running back Ethan Duran gave Miners fans a glimpse of what they have to look forward to for the next three years as the sophomores combined for five touchdowns on the night while helping the offense chew up over 300 yards of total offense in route to the big win.

The defense chipped in with inspired play as well, forcing three turnovers and limiting the Raton offense to a little over 100 yards on the night while holding them scoreless. This is the first time any team has been held to goose eggs since the rivalry was renewed in 2006.

'I think we executed well," said Miners head coach Randy Begano, who is back in the driver's seat after sitting out last season. "We put the ball on the ground a few times and that cold have hurt us, we need to work on that. But

we did a good job controlling the line of scrimmage and moving the ball, that is a key for us. I give a lot of credit to the offensive line. They played really well tonight.'

Ferraro accounted for 100 yards of offense and managed Begano's trademark veer offense to perfection. The sophomore had touchdown runs of 16 and 38 yards and also added a 40-yard touchdown pass to Izzy Manzanares late in the first quarter to extend the Miners lead to 21-0. "Vance is getting better. Our veer attack is three headed and we had it all working right tonight. We ran the ball well; our passing game was on point, when you have 10 guys stacked up in the box you have to throw it sometime," said Begano.

The win moves the Miners record to 2-0 on the season. They will be on the road against Rye this week and Alamosa next week before returning home for a meeting with Tri-Peaks League foe, Florence on September 26. Rye comes into the game with a 2-1 record and a very potent offensive attack that is capable of scoring points in bunches and in a multitude ways. The Miners will have their hands full as they look to slow down running back Trey Zupancic, who is averaging seven yards per carry and has amassed 700 yards rushing on the season thus far. Kickoff is scheduled for 7 p.m.


