Methodist Pastor jailed on domestic harassment charge

Huerfano County sheriff's deputies arrested the pastor of a Trinidad church on Tuesday, October 13, on an accusation of a misde-

meanor count of domestic harassment. Bobby Barnhill, 59, is the pastor at First United Methodist Church in Trinidad, and was placed in the County Jail on a \$5,000 bond, where he was still being held Thursday morning, according to a sheriff's department spokesperson.

Barnhill's next court appearance is set for 1:30 p.m., on Tuesday, November 3, in Third District

Court at the Huerfano County Courthouse in Walsenburg. His Colorado criminal record shows several similar harassment arrests dating back to 1999, though most of the charges were later dismissed. He pled guilty to a felony drug charge in El Paso County in 2004, and was sentenced to a threeyear term with the Colorado Department of Corrections, less time served

Deputies were called to a rural Rye address at approximately
