

Trojan Golfers qualify for **National** ournament

The Trojan Golfers wrapped up the regular season with the Region IX trophy in hand and their ticket punched to the 2015 National Tournament in Newton, Kansas, TSJC won the Eastern Wyoming Invitational last weekend to wrap

up region play. The tournament was the best team showing of the season with four players shooting under par on the final day to win by 19 strokes.

Jake Ice claimed the tournament title shooting 6-under par in 36 holes. He was followed by teammate Justin Carlock, who finished as tournament runner-up with a two-day total of 3-under par. Justin Frederick shot 69 on the last day, which left him at 2-over par for the tournament. Carlos Sisneros was the fourth player to go under par on the last day shooting a 71, making his two-day total at 3-over par.

In all, the Trojans top four scores for the tournament netted them a 5-under par team tournament finish. Frazer Pomfret fin-

Karen and Richard Carpenter reached world acclaim in the 1970s with their popular albums and songs such as "Close to You," "Rainy Days & Mondays," "Superstar" and "We've Only Just Begun."


In "Close to You: The Music of The Carpenters," Lisa Rock and her six-piece band re-create the songs and performances of The Carpenters in a show that's touring the upper Midwest with a long string of one-nighters. The Raton show is bookended by shows in Kansas and South Da-

Lisa Rock—her real name—was 13 when Karen Carpenter died at 32 of heart failure brought on by complications of anorexia. After many other musical pursuits, Rock created her "Close to You" show five years ago and has garnered positive reviews for regular tours. "When she





