


# OVER THE PASS

### Jackson off to great start, Padres end up losing to Rockies in 10

SAN DIEGO (AP) — Edwin Jackson got off to a great start Sunday by retiring the first nine Colorado Rockies batters.

He couldn't keep it going. Charlie Blackmon homered leading off the fourth and then hit an RBI single in the fifth.

Jackson was long gone by the time Mark Reynolds homered leading off the 10th inning to give the Rockies a 3-2 victory and a split of a four-game series.

"I didn't necessarily feel like I had my best stuff, as far as strength-wise," Jackson said. "I think I could've went out there for another inning, but it's a two-nothing game. We have guys on the bench trying to come out and produce

runs. It's a pitchers' duel."

Jackson allowed two runs and five hits in six innings, struck out four and walked one.

"I thought he was able to hold them down without having his sharpest stuff," manager Andy Green said. "I think his mentality was right. I think his approach was right. Wasn't his absolute best stuff, but he was still more than enough to navigate six innings very well."

Reynolds' homer was the 250th of his career and 13th of the season. It came on a 2-2 pitch from Kevin Quackenbush (7-6).

Jake McGee (2-3) pitched the ninth for the win. Adam Ottavino pitched the 10th for his fourth save in eight chances.

Blackmon gave the Rockies a 2-0 lead with his homer leading off the fourth and an RBI single with two outs in the fifth.

Nick Hundley hit a leadoff double in the fifth and scored on Blackmon's single. Blackmon got caught in a rundown to end the inning.

Rockies right-hander Chad Bettis was cruising with a one-hit shutout before the Padres tied it at 2 in the sixth. Travis Jankowski doubled to left-center and scored on Wil Myers' triple that rolled to the fence in right-center. Yangervis Solarte brought in Myers with a sacrifice fly.

Bettis went seven, allowing two runs and four hits, with five strikeouts and one walk.

Fort Lewis, both NCAA DII four-year programs.

The TSJC women's team scored 85 points in the race, while the men's team notched 80 points, ahead of Johnson & Wales. Adams State was perfect in both events scoring 15 points respectively.

The Trojan women were led by Wyonna Martin who finished the 5K with a time of 20:35.9. Her sister, Winona was hot on her heels with a time of 20:39.3. Brianna Molina (21:13.1), Maria Montes (21:15.0) and Margarita Jones (22:13.0) rounded out the field for the Trojans. ASU's Jenna Thurman won the individual title in 17:25.0.

Head Coach Lauren Martin was pleased with the effort of her team noting, "The women ran a really strong race. They went up against strong opposition in the defending Division II National Champions. They fought the whole way and are only going to get better and better with more experience."

Elias Gedyon was the only Trojan to win an individual award, finishing in 26:08.9 on the 8K men's course, good enough for 13th place. Daniel Haymes finished 20th overall with a time of 27:22.3. Cody Latone (28:38.1), Manual Villegas (29:25.0) and Nicolas Molina (29:34.3) rounded out the field for the Trojans. ASU's Sydney Gidabuday torched

the field to finish first overall with a time of 24:54.20.

"This was a great first meet for the men," Coach Martin said. "I am proud of how they competed. I am looking forward to us getting better every week from here."

With their inaugural race behind them, the Trojans will now settle into the rest of their season. They will next compete in Gunnison, Colorado at the Mountaineer/Cowboy Invite hosted by Western State Colorado University on September 17.

This last weekend the team skunked Sheridan 4-0 on Friday and ran away from Northwest College, 3-1, on Saturday.

The Trojans started the season on the road at Garden City in a non-region contest. After a scoreless first half the Broncbusters struck first with a goal in the 52' minute from Alexis Lopez. TSJC would tie it up about twenty minutes later when Biska Biyombo found a ball off a corner kick and drove it past the keeper. Biyombo would score the game winner six minutes later when he took a through ball from Filip Cvetinovic, outraced the defenders, before dodging the keeper and finding the net. Hector Haros had 12 saves in goal for the Trojans.

Following that, a fired up Trojan squad jumped out early over Central CC at Los Ninos park. Emiliano Gomez scored what would be the game

winner in the fourth minute off of an assist from Biyombo. The Trojans would get goals from Filip Mili-vojevic, Biyombo (2), Cvetinovic (2), Khori Edmond, Jerney Klepac and another from Gomez to make it a 9-0 victory. The Trojans outshot the Raiders 32-9 in the game.

Later things were much tighter, as a much-improved Northeastern team came to town fresh off of a victory in La Junta against Otero on Saturday. The Trojans spent most of the game on the attack, but Plainsmen keeper Akim Larmond made seven saves to keep the game scoreless into the 70' minute. Trinidad finally broke through when a cross from Carlos Alonso found Cvetinovic in the box. A beautiful header into the net made the score 1-0. On the following kickoff, Biyombo stole the ball and powered past the defenders to drive a shot into

the net and put the game away 2-0. Haros continued his strong leadership from the goal recording had six more saves and the defensive unit in front of him controlled the game for their second straight shutout.

"I am happy with the performance this weekend," commented Head Coach Aaron Miller. "It's always great to start the season off strong with dominant wins in the South Region IX. I believe this group has the potential to have a great season, should they continue to work hard and stay humble. I challenged the guys to improve their mental focus and not take ANY team lightly this season. Also, I would like to thank the fans who attended the first-ever Men's soccer match at Los Ninos."

The Trojans will return home on Wednesday, September 14 for a match with rival Otero.
